# **Doug's Discussion**

## Bedtime Stories

Picture a young child being tucked into bed at night. Like children throughout the ages, she wants a story. "Okay," says Mom, "I'll tell you something wonderful that happened to you when you were just a tiny little thing. I had heard there was a special new teacher in Israel. You were still very young, but there was no one to watch you, so you and I went to see Him. This teacher was everything people said and more! I even saw Him heal someone who was blind so that he could see again!" At this, the little girl's eyes grow wide. "Really?" "Yes, really. He was . . . well, I think He must have been the Messiah. When I realized who He was, I thought how wonderful it would be if He would bless you. I was very nervous – but I managed to get near Him and asked this amazing man who could heal people if He would like to hold you and . . . He did. Isn't that amazing? Little girl, you were once held by the Messiah!" And, of course, the child marvels at the very thought.

What do you think about the parents who struggled to get through the crowd to bring their children to Jesus? There was a time when the disciples didn't think much of that effort. "People were also bringing babies to Jesus to have him touch them. When the disciples saw this, they rebuked them" (Luke 18:15). Guys, come on. Jesus is too busy for such a silly waste of His time! It's not like these kids are going to remember the experience anyway. Jesus had different ideas: "Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these" (18:16). Parents and small children were making great efforts to get to Jesus. They were trying their hardest to have just a fleeting moment with the Savior. Jesus was not about to discourage or hinder that attitude. The disciples may have thought it frivolous, but I can easily imagine that one moment with Jesus becoming a family story that is passed down for generations.

What would you do for a moment with Jesus? What would you do to help your children have a moment with Him? Yes, He has ascended to heaven, but that doesn't mean that we are completely without His presence. The last words of the Gospel of Matthew are Jesus saying: "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of age." Here, Jesus promises to accompany those who are living out the mission of the church. Jesus also promises to meet with those who assemble in His name (Matt. 18:20). The opportunity to come to Jesus still exists, and we certainly should bring our children! May I suggest a good story the next time a child or grandchild asks you? "Sure, let me tell you something wonderful that happened to me when I was younger. I heard that there was a teacher who could do incredible things – even raise people from the dead! I know how that sounds, but I had to know if it was true, so I picked up a Bible to read the story for myself. I now believe it's all true. I think Jesus was the Savior, and it's so wonderful to live for Him. And I hope – when you're old enough, that you decide to live for Him too!"

I'm sure some would say that kind of story is a waste of time. Parents are too busy for that kind of thing. Just like your kids, watch another video on YouTube before bed. But I won't say that. No, being the crowd who discourages doesn't make as good a story as being the one who fights through it to get you and your children to Jesus.

# Clothed with Humility

It was a hot day for the first day of December. I remember the first day of the West Virginia State Police Academy very well. The instructors pushed our bodies to the point that they would cramp up, and the instructors would then yell, "Hydrate!" We would gulp down an electrolyte drink, and back at it, we would go. They wanted the ones who really did not want it or who were not prepared for this journey to quit. However, I wanted that green uniform of a West Virginia State Trooper almost more than anything in the whole wide world. The instructors stood perfectly in their Class A uniforms. Their boots were polished to a mirror-like reflection, the badge on their chest blinded you with its shine, and their uniforms were pressed and creased without a single wrinkle. I would not dare to even imagine myself in that uniform until I earned it. There are many slogans in the WVSP, and one is "You Want It, You Earn It!"

Oh, boy, did they ever make me earn that uniform! That uniform, when I wore it, represented who I was and what I stood for. Strangers knew to approach me with certain matters and trusted me with them based on what I was wearing. As Christians, we should also aim to present ourselves in a way that is a proper representation of Jesus Christ. The apostle Paul actually begs us to do this! "I BESEECH you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you PRESENT YOUR BODIES a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service" (Romans 12:1 NKJV, emphasis mine). This Scripture discusses far more than how we present our bodies with clothing. However, how we dress is certainly part of our presentation, and as the Scripture encourages, our presentation should be "holy" and "acceptable to God."

Go to God's word to access His mind when determining what is "acceptable to God." It is through the inspired writers we can know God (1 Corinthians 2:10-12). We can also know for certain that what is "acceptable to God" is the opposite of what is trending in the world. "And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God" (Romans 12:2).

The uniform that I wore was difficult to maintain and later became almost a burden for most. However, if a Trooper would substitute the uniform for something else, we become unrecognizable to those we protect and serve. The uniform was not solely for us or me but for the benefit of others who saw me. What tragedy it would have been if someone needed help and I missed helping them because I was out of uniform! The world will tell you to dress and wear whatever makes you feel proud and not worry about anyone else. The world's mindset is it is their problem if your clothing or lack of it causes someone to stumble! That is not the case with God. He wants you to be clothed with Christ (Romans 13:14; Galatians 3:27) and to be presented as a holy representative of Him (2 Corinthians 5:20). "...Yes, all of you be submissive to one another, and be CLOTHED WITH HUMILITY, for 'God resists the proud, But gives to the humble'" (1 Peter 5:5, emphasis mine). As a Christian, your uniform was given to you by the grace of God, and you did not earn it. Cherish the gifts God has given you and adorn yourselves modestly (1 Timothy 2:9). What influence do you present for Jesus and others out of uniform?
